**Kurzbeschreibung:**

Was ist Entwicklung? Welche Rolle spielt der Staat in der (Unter-)Entwicklung von Gesellschaften und Ökonomien in Afrika und Asien? Weshalb haben sich in Teilen Nord- und Südasiens „Entwicklungsstaaten“ herausgebildet, kaum aber in Afrika? Lassen sich vorteilhafte Rahmenbedingungen und -politiken zwischen und innerhalb von Regionen transferieren? Wo liegen vorkoloniale, koloniale und postkoloniale Merkmale von Staatlichkeit und Staatskapazität, welche relevant für soziökonomische Entwicklung erscheinen? Diese Fragen stehen im Zentrum der Veranstaltung. Der Schwerpunkt des Seminars liegt auf der Erarbeitung, kritischen Diskussion und Vertiefung neuerer theoretischer Ansätze und Befunde der empirisch-vergleichenden Politischen Ökonomie des subsaharischen Afrikas und Ostasiens.
