

**Heidelberg University Examination Rules and Regulations for the Master's Degree Programme in
– Specific Section –
Estudios iberoamericanos. Teoría y metodología del contacto /
Ibero-American Studies. Contact- Theories and Methods**

dated 15 April 2016

On the basis of § 32 of the State Law of Baden-Württemberg on Higher Education (Landeshochschulgesetz- LHG), last amended by the law on equal opportunities for men and women in public service in Baden-Württemberg and the amendment to the LHG dated 23 February 2016 (GBl. from 26 February 2016, p. 108), the Heidelberg University Senate has issued the following examination rules and regulations - specific section - for the Master's degree programme in Estudios iberoamericanos. Teoría y metodología del contacto/ Ibero-American Studies. Contact - Theories and Methods.

Approved by the President on 15 April 2016.

Any employment and occupational titles mentioned in these regulations refer to both women and men and may be used in the corresponding feminine form. This also applies to university degrees and academic titles.

§ 1 Applicability of the General Section

The current version of the Heidelberg University examination rules and regulations – General Section - for the Master's programmes in Modern Languages and Literary Studies at the Faculty of Modern Languages form an integral part of these examination rules and regulations.

§ 2 Subject of the academic programme

- (1) The focus of the Master's degree programme in *Estudios iberoamericanos. Teoría y metodología del contacto/ Ibero-American Studies. Contact - Theories and Methods* lies on those areas of Hispanic and Lusitanian Literary and Cultural Studies, Linguistics, and *Transcultural Studies* that share a connection with transcultural contact phenomena in Latin America, the Iberian Peninsula, and between Europe and Latin America.

The successful completion of a B.A. in a philological or cultural subject is a prerequisite for this degree programme. The programme itself is concerned with the literary, linguistic and cultural phenomena that arise through the contact across territorial, ethnic, political and religious boundaries within a linguistic and cultural region. A particular focus is placed on the link between Ibero-American linguistic and cultural regions, and literary traditions.

The Master's degree programme is research-orientated. On the one hand, it has a theoretical and methodological approach, and on the other hand, it teaches students the important practical aspects of scientific work (incl. organising, implementing and participating in a scientific forum) that can be applied to different professional fields where complex problems must be solved.

The degree programme provides an integral perspective on Latin American Studies, which includes Spanish America and Brazil. Courses in Linguistics, Cultural Studies and Literary Studies broaden students' knowledge and skills, and their weighting can be individually defined. Language skills are also taught and consolidated. The programme requires students to be proficient in Spanish equivalent to C1 level (CEFR). Knowledge of Portuguese is not a prerequisite.

- (2) The requirements for admission to the academic programme as a major subject are subject to separate admission regulations.
- (3) The academic programme as a minor subject builds on basic knowledge of philological or cultural aspects, and includes examples from Hispanic literature, language and culture, which are linked to transcultural contact phenomena that transcend territorial, ethnic, political and religious borders in Latin America, the Iberian Peninsula and between Europe and Latin America.
- (4) The prerequisite for admission to the academic programme as a minor subject is a B.A. (or comparable degree) in a philological or cultural degree programme with a subject weighting of at least 25% or 35 credits (*ECTS*). Moreover, students should have sufficient knowledge of Spanish equivalent to B2 level (CEFR) or better. This can be certified by the following documents:
 - a university entrance qualification or university degree from a Spanish speaking country;
 - a Bachelor's degree where *Spanish Philology* (or a programme with the same or similar content) is weighted at least 50%;
 - a DELE (*Diploma de Español como Lengua Extranjera*) from the *Instituto Cervantes* graded "Nivel B2";
 - a *Certificado de Español Comercial* (CEC) or *Diploma de Español Comercial* (DEC) B2;
 - *The European Language Certificates*: TELC "Español B";
 - or a different certificate proving the respective language proficiency.

§ 3 Programme structure and range of courses offered

- (1) The academic programme is structured in accordance with § 3 paragraph 3 item 1 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme. The required modules and corresponding courses are set forth in Appendix 2 (for the major subject) and Appendix 3 (for the minor

subject) of the examination rules and regulations.

- (2) The Master's degree programme requires language proficiency in German equivalent to at least A2 level (CEFR). Students without a German university entrance qualification or a Bachelor's degree in a programme with German as the language of instruction must provide proof of their German language proficiency upon submission of their Master's thesis at the latest. Examples of proof include:
- Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang (German language exams for university admission): DSH A2;
 - the German Language Diploma of the Conference of German Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs, German Language Diploma Level 1 (CEFR A2/B1);
 - Goethe-Zertifikat A2;
 - the Zentrale Oberstufenprüfung of the Goethe-Institut graded at least 'pass';
 - the Großes Deutsches Sprachdiplom of Goethe-Institut graded at least 'pass';
 - the TestDaf-examination (German as foreign language) (basis-deutsch A2);
 - Zertifikat Deutsch für den Beruf (Professional German) (A2);
 - *The European Language Certificates*: TELC A2;
 - or a different certificate proving the respective language proficiency.
- (3) Courses and examinations are generally conducted in Spanish or Portuguese. Courses and examinations may also be fully or partially conducted in German or English.
- (4) The Master's degree programme in *Estudios iberoamericanos. Teoría y metodología del contacto / Ibero-American Studies. Contact - Theories and Methods* can be studied part-time.
- (5) The Department of Romance Studies at Heidelberg University expects and encourages students to undertake an extended stay in a country where Spanish or Portuguese is spoken. A semester or year of study abroad may generally be taken at any point during the course of study. It is suggested that students undertake a semester abroad during the 3rd academic semester. Any course or module of this degree programme may generally be completed at a university abroad and will be recognised in accordance with § 7 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme. It is recommended that students consult the responsible student advisor in good time.

§ 4 Master's examination

The Master's examination in the major subject consists of the examination compo-

nents taken during the course of study according to Appendix 2, the Master's thesis, and the final oral examination. The Master's examination in the minor subject consists of the examination components taken during the course of study according to Appendix 3 of the examination rules and regulations.

§ 5 Requirements for admission to the Master's examination

- (1) In accordance with § 13 paragraph 2 of the General Section, students seeking admission to the Master's thesis must additionally present certificates confirming the award of 52 credits for the successful completion of the modules and courses set forth in Appendix 2.
- (2) The final oral examination may only be taken, once:
 1. all prerequisites as defined in § 13 para. 3 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master Degree programme have been fulfilled, and
 2. proof of German language proficiency has been submitted (where necessary)

§ 6 Master's thesis

The Master's thesis can be submitted in Spanish, Portuguese, German or English and is to cover a linguistic, literary or cultural topic. If the thesis is written in a foreign language, it must contain a summary in German encompassing approximately 5 % of the total scope of the thesis. The topic of the Master's thesis may be taken from a seminar, a forum or from a field in which the student has specialised. Further details are set forth under § 16 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme.

§ 7 Final oral examination

- (1) A final oral examination must be taken in the major subject. The final oral examination is conducted by one examiner and one qualified observer. The examiner is to be chosen from the field in which the Master's thesis was written (Linguistics, Literary Studies, Cultural Studies).
- (2) The three examination topics are taken from the field in which the Master's thesis was written. The topics of the examination, which should be suitably differentiated from that of the Master's thesis, are determined by the thesis supervisor in consultation with the candidate.
- (3) The final oral examination lasts 45 minutes (15 minutes per examination topic) and accounts for 6 credits.
- (4) At least half of the examination is conducted in Spanish or Portuguese.
- (5) Further details are set forth under § 18 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme.

§ 8 Calculation of the overall grade

When calculating the overall grade for the Master's examination in accordance with § 19 paragraph 2 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme, the unrounded numerical values of all module grades except for the modules

- Introduction to *Transcultural Studies*
- Master Seminar LS/LI/CS
- Forum
- Language Practice: Portuguese

are used and weighted based on the number of credits as outlined in Appendix 2. The grade of the final oral examination is weighted by a factor of 2.

§ 9 Coming into force

The above examination rules and regulations become effective on the first day of the month following their publication in the Bulletin of the President (Mitteilungsblatt des Rektors).

Unless indicated otherwise, credits are awarded in accordance with the following requirements: Regular and active participation in a module's lectures and courses (see section entitled 'Contact time'); extensive and intensive independent study; successful completion of examination components.

Grades are awarded in line with § 12 of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme.

The range of assessment types is kept as broad as possible and includes in particular written examinations, oral presentations, oral examinations, written assignments, dossiers, essays, project work, course content portfolios, posters, lecture notes and assessments conducted throughout the course such as short presentations and *reaction papers*. According to § 15 (2) of the General Section of the examination rules and regulations for the Master's programme, the instructor of the course determines the assessment type (oral and/or written) and announces his or her decision no later than at the beginning of the course.

Types of course & explanation

Forum: a 1 or 2 day block course (in various formats), which is organised by students (under the guidance of an advisor). A forum facilitates academic exchange between academics and students, and includes contributions from the students themselves (e.g. presentations, panel discussions, posters etc.) The annual forum is generally attended by all students of the Master's degree programme. Students of the first academic year organise the forum, while students of the second academic year make their own academic contribution.

Preparatory Seminar: a multi-functional seminar at intermediate level, which is divided into several parts (for advanced Bachelor's students and entry-level Master's students. It particularly serves to standardise the differing levels at which students begin a Master's degree programme).

Preparatory Seminar+: A preparatory Seminar (see above) with additional requirements, therefore worth 6 CP instead of 4 CP.

Main Seminar: a multi-functional seminar at advanced level, which is divided into several parts (for Bachelor's students in the final phase of their studies or Master's students).

Masterseminar: interdisciplinary seminar (LS, LI, CS) for Master students only. The annual Master Seminar is attended by all students in a cohort (first academic year). The seminar provides students with a thorough introduction to the thematic field of the programme and creates a shared subject-specific basis for students, who began the Master's degree programme with different levels of knowledge acquired from different Bachelor's degree programmes and higher education systems.
