**§ 1 Applicability of the General Section**

The Heidelberg University examination rules and regulations for the Bachelor's programmes in modern languages and literature studies at the Faculty of Modern Languages - General Section - form an integral part of these examination rules and regulations.

**§ 2 Subject of the academic programme**

- (1) The requirements for admission to the academic programme are subject to separate admission regulations.
- (2) The subjects of the Bachelor's degree programme in German philology are the German language and literature from their beginnings to the present day in the context of their historical development, society and culture as well as their theoretical principles.

**§ 3 Programme structure and possible combinations**

- (1) The academic programme is structured in accordance with § 3 para. 2 of the General Section of the Bachelor's examination rules and regulations of the Faculty of Modern Languages. The required modules and corresponding courses are listed in Annex 1.

The degree programme consists of an initial basic module, which serves as an introduction to the sub-disciplines of the subject (hereinafter referred to as "special fields"), and two further basic modules where students broaden and practice the acquired basic knowledge. Additionally, the 1st and 2nd major subjects (accounting for 50% of degree) offer two specialised modules comprising the in-depth study of one of the three special fields. The three special fields are German linguistics, medieval German philology and modern German literary studies.

The academic programme is composed of a basic stage (1st and 2nd semesters), an advanced stage (3rd and 4th semesters), and a specialised stage (5th and 6th semesters). All special fields are studied to the same

extend during the basic stage. During the advanced and specialised stages, the study of the special fields is continued as part of the basic module; at the same time, 1st and 2nd major subject students focus on one of the special fields. Minor subject (25%) students of German philology specialise on one of the three special fields (German linguistics, medieval German philology, modern German literary studies).

- (1a) Part-time study is allowed in the German philology Bachelor's degree programme.
- (2) Heidelberg University offers the philology degree programme in German studies as a 1st or 2nd major subject accounting for 50% (74 CP) of the degree, and as a minor subject accounting for 25% (35 CP) of the degree.
- (3) The orientation examination is held during the course of study. For 1st or 2nd majors (50% option), the examination consists of the successful completion of two introductory courses: the introduction to modern German literary studies and the introduction to medieval studies (Middle High German). For minor subject (25% option) students, the orientation examination consists of the successful completion of the medieval studies (Middle High German) introductory course. Successful completion of either introductory course requires sitting a 90-minute written examination, which must be graded "sufficient" (4.0) or better.
- (4) The Latinum certificate and literary and academic reading proficiency in at least two other foreign languages are required to complete the Bachelor's degree programme as a 1st or 2nd major subject (50% option). Knowledge of two foreign languages is required for minor subject (25% option) students. The Latinum certificate is not required for the minor subject (25% option); Latin may, however, be one of the two required foreign languages. Proof of proficiency (generally four years of school study / B1 level pursuant to the Common European Framework of Reference) may be furnished in the form of the university entrance qualification and/or equivalent certificates. As the Latinum certificate and proof of reading proficiency in two other foreign languages (for the 50% major subject option) or knowledge of two foreign languages (for the 25% minor subject option) are required to attend any 5th and 6th semester courses, they must generally be furnished by the end of the 4th academic semester. If the required language skills are not shown in the university entrance qualification certificate and must be acquired during the course of study, two semesters will be deducted from the calculation of the standard period of study.
- (5) Generally, the subjects of the Bachelor's programmes may be freely combined, provided that the respective programmes are offered. Combinations with the comparative German studies degree programme (Department of German as a Foreign Language) are not allowed.

#### **§ 4 Requirements for admission to Bachelor's examination**

In accordance to § 13 para. 2 of the General Section, admission to the Bachelor's thesis requires the submission of additional certificates:

1. certificates of completion of the modules and courses set forth under Annex 1, accounting for 60 credits earned in the German philology degree programme (Module B 1.1 to B 3.1)
2. the Latinum certificate.

## **§ 5 Final examination**

The B.A. final examination is an oral examination, which is taken by students of German philology as a 1st or 2nd major (50% option) or minor subject (25% option). Further details are subject to § 18 of the General Section of the Bachelor's examination rules and regulations, and § 7 of these examination rules and regulations.

## **§ 6 Bachelor's thesis**

- (1) The Bachelor's thesis in the German philology degree programme (1st major subject, 50% option) is written in the student's chosen special field.
- (2) The Bachelor's thesis must be written in German and should generally contain about 40 pages.

## **§ 7 Oral final examination**

- (1) In the major subject, the examination is held by two examiners. If, upon registering for the examination, the examinee did not exercise his or her right to suggest the examiners, the names of the examiners will be notified to him or her no later than one week prior to the oral examination.  
In the 1st and 2nd major subject (50% option), the examination is held in the two disciplines chosen as part of the B 3.1 (special field) and B 3.2 modules.
  1. In the special field (Module B 3.1), two topics will be examined for a duration of 20 minutes, respectively. If the special field is modern German literary studies, two separate topics must be chosen from the fields of author and epoch or genre or literary theory/poetology. If the special field is linguistics, two topics must be chosen from the fields "language as a system" or "language as a means of communication" or "language history". If the special field is medieval studies, two topics pertaining to two separate areas, must be chosen.
  2. In the second discipline (module B 3.2), one topic from the fields set forth under 1 will be examined for a duration of 20 minutes.
- (2) In the minor subject, the examination will be held by one examiner in the presence of a competent observer, the examination will cover the special field. If, upon registering for the examination, the examinee did not exercise his or her right to

suggest an examiner, the name of the examiner will be notified to him or her no later than one week prior to the oral examination.

- (3) The examination will cover two topics, which will be examined for a duration of 20 minutes, respectively. If modern German literary studies is the special field, two separate topics must be chosen from the following fields: author or epoch or genre or literary theory/poetology. If linguistics is the special field, two topics must be chosen from the following fields: "Language as a system" or "Language as a means of communication" or "History of language". If medieval studies is the special field, two topics pertaining to two separate areas must be chosen.
- (4) 5 credits are awarded if the oral final examination in the German philology degree programme is passed.
- (5) The examination lasts 60 minutes in the 1st and 2nd major subject (50% option) and 40 minutes in the minor subject (25% option).

## **§ 8 Calculation of the subject grade**

To calculate the subject grade pursuant to § 19 of the General Section, all modules grades except the grade awarded for module B 2.1/b are combined.

## **§ 9 Entry into force**

These examination rules and regulations become effective on the first day of the month following their publication in the President's bulletin (Mitteilungsblatt des Rektors). Upon request, the examination rules and regulations in the version of 9 July 2009 may be applied for three more years to students already enrolled in the Bachelor's degree programme in German philology at Heidelberg University on this date.

## **Annex 1: Module structure of the German philology Bachelor's degree programme**

B 3.2/a-c: 2 sem. hrs. – 9 CP Module BA B 3.2./a-c may not belong to the same discipline as BA B 2.2 and BA B 3.1.

The award of credits for module B 3.2 requires successful prior completion of the preparatory seminar and lecture course in the corresponding discipline chosen for module B 2.1.

B 3.4: Bachelor's thesis: maximum of 6 weeks – 12 CP (in 1st major subject only)

B 3.5: Bachelor's examination: maximum of 3 weeks – 5 CP
